## Remember

As a Worldwide Sponsor, Visa is the only payment card accepted at the Olympic and Paralympic Games and the only card accepted at all venues of the Rio 2016 Olympic and Paralympic Games for any official Rio 2016 related transactions.

- 1 To get a Visa debit, credit or prepaid card, visit your bank or go to www.visa.com/globalgateway.
- 2 | Remember to notify your issuing bank or financial institution that you will be traveling and that you will be using your Visa debit, credit or prepaid card abroad to avoid any issues when transacting.

- 3 | Contact your issuing bank about travel-related benefits for Visa account holders.
- 4 | Register for SMS notification with your specific bank, or your bank's transaction notification service. This allows you to track transactions on your account. Standard SMS rates apply.
- 5 | Opt-in for services such as Mobile Location Confirmation via your card issuer's banking app or Visa's Travel Authorization Tag. These opt-in services share your location with your card's issuer to notify them of your travel plans, preventing your credit or debit card transactions from being denied. Contact your mobile service provider for data rate information.

- 6 | While you're traveling, set up automatic bill pay for your credit card and make sure you have sufficient funds in your debit account.
- 7 | If you lose your card, report it to your issuing bank or financial institution immediately! Place a collect call through your local operator to 1-303-967-1090 for assistance.
- 8 | Look for the Visa or PLUS logo at point-of-sale to ensure international payment cards are accepted. To find the nearest ATM visit www.visa.com/atmlocator/index.jsp

- 9 | Make transactions even more secure by paying via a chipactivated terminal with a credit or debit card upgraded with chip technology.
- 10 | Always have a small amount of local currency (BLR), plus a Visa payment card on you while traveling.
- 11 Carefully review your payment card statements and contact your issuing bank or financial institution immediately if you see any suspicious or incorrect charges.
